Accurate and regularly updated information helps us to support your child, keep track of their progress and ensures smooth communication with you as a parent.

# Learning Together Online

All virtual classrooms at TheOnlineSchool.UK are guaranteed to be safe and engaging environments for learning. Every lesson is a fantastic opportunity for collaboration between teacher and students.



Here's how your child can make the most of their virtual classroom experience:

Ratings and Rewards: At the end of every lesson, both students and teachers are encouraged to reflect on the session. Students have the ability to provide feedback about the lesson, they can rate teacher performance and select an emoji which reflects their feelings. Similarly, Teachers will review the session by assigning thumbs up/down and star rewards to students as indicators of performance and behaviour. These quick reactions will appear on a student's dashboard report accompanied by any personalised comments and/or targets from their teacher.

<u>Demonstrate Classroom Etiquette:</u> Just like in any team situation, it's important for each individual student to embody our school ethos through their classroom conduct. Our classroom guidelines are in place to ensure the safety and comfort of everyone in the virtual classroom.

- Respect others Treat your teachers and peers with kindness and respect at all times.
- Be mindful of your words and actions Avoid swearing or inappropriate language.
- Participate positively Do not spam or share unrelated links in the public chat which disrupt the flow of classroom discussion.
- Protect your privacy Avoid sharing personal details in public chats, privately message an admin first and they will assist you in sharing with friends.
- Practice patience Raise your (virtual) hand and wait your turn before unmuting.

If you feel that any of these guidelines have been violated, message staff either inside or outside of the classroom. Teaching support staff are present in lessons alongside the teacher leading the session so effective monitoring and reporting of any incidents is always carried out.

<u>Active Participation:</u> Actively participating in lessons is a crucial part of your learning journey and there are lots of ways to do that. Engage in discussions, ask questions, and contribute your ideas via private or public chat, use microphone and video, answer polls... Remember, there is no such thing as a silly question and your insights can enrich the learning experience for everyone. Your voice matters!

<u>Safety Measures:</u> At TheOnlineSchool.UK, we prioritise the safety of our students. We kindly request that students refrain from sharing personal details in public chats. Instead, they can share contact details with friends during After School Club where admin staff are able to facilitate safe exchange of information.

We believe that a positive and respectful virtual classroom environment enhances the learning experience for everyone. Together, let's create a space where we can thrive academically and forge meaningful connections!





- Talk at their students rather than with them



# **5 Academic Enjoyment** *Excelling in Your Studies*

At TheOnlineSchool.uk, we truly believe that happy students are successful students. We avoid placing unnecessary pressure on our young people and instead encourage them to set their own targets in line with personal future goals.

By establishing a culture of responsibility and commitment, we can create an environment where every student can thrive...



<u>Punctuality and Attendance:</u> Whilst we do encourage students attend lessons regularly and on time, we also recognise that sometimes things happen outside of our control. Students will never be told off for missing a lesson or arriving late, instead we check that they are okay and provide them with the necessary support to catch-up on anything they might have missed. All lessons are recorded as standard so regardless of tech issues, illness or appointments, your child can still access all their lessons.

<u>Commitment to Learning:</u> Our timetable is fantastically flexible in that it offers breaks throughout the school day and an extra long weekend for students. We encourage students to show their dedication and complete some revision or independent study during certain gaps to increase their confidence and consolidate key knowledge.

<u>Completion of Homework Assignments:</u> Homework assignments play a vital role in reinforcing learning and assessing student understanding of the subject matter. We want your child to challenge themselves without feeling overwhelmed so homework tasks are not obligatory. If a student can't complete a particular task, they don't have to. They will not be sanctioned but rather supported through the content and any negative feelings of stress or anxiety.

**Exam Preparedness:** For many of our KS4 students, iGCSEs are an important objective at the end of their learning journey. Currently there is no online provision for taking iGCSE exams so parents play a crucial role in coordinating and planning their child's exam season. Whilst our teaching team will ensure that students are ready to sit their exams academically, logistically parents are responsible for booking and funding a place at a local exam centre. Our team have plenty of experience in organising the necessary support so will guide families through this process.

# 12 Home Educating

### Transition from Mainstream School

#### How do I deregister my child from mainstream school?

If your child is currently attending or enrolled in a physical school, you <u>must</u> inform the school if you now plan to educate them at home.



The school must accept your letter of de-registration if you're taking your child out to home educate. The school is then obliged to inform the local authority of children removed from its admission register and will give home education as the reason, if notified of this by the parent.

Parents of children withdrawn from school for home education are not legally obliged to inform the local authority themselves, but it is sensible to also do so yourself in order to avoid any misunderstandings as to how you intend to fulfil your parental responsibility for your child's education.

#### Which subjects should my child take, is there a minimum number of subjects or lessons that they need?

Maths and English are essential subjects. We highly recommend our Base Package which comprises of the three core subjects. Maths, English and Science. Subject selection is completely flexible and we encourage all students to select classes that they are interested in. Subjects can be picked up and dropped throughout the year if a student is unhappy with their initial choice(s).

Regardless of subject selection, we will provide evidence of what your child covers in each lesson and this information can be sent to the local authority.

#### What is the process of booking and preparing for exams?

It is still possible for students to take GCSEs and iGCSEs as well as A levels if they are home educated.

The process is relatively straightforward and our expert team will guide you through the process:

You will need to register your child as a private candidate at a private exam centre local to you. You will then pay the exam centre directly according to the price of each exam paper and the cost of any extra support or provision requested for your child on exam days. Currently the cost of the actual exam papers ranges from between £150 and £250 depending on the subject and exam levels.

#### What do I need to show my local authority's home education officer?

Some local authorities will ask to see the child at home or in another location, as well as seeing examples of work done. As parents, you are under no legal obligation from education law to agree to such a meeting or to produce specific evidence. It is however vital to carefully consider the reasons for not doing so, what is in the best interests of your child,? and what is the most sensible approach?


